Loving God, as a parish community, nourished by your Word and Eucharist,


we ask you to grant us wisdom, courage and generosity so that we might:

### From Fr. Tom

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

There was exciting news last week, when Pope



Francis named Fr. John Keehner to be the next bishop of the Diocese of Sioux City in Iowa. I have known Fr. Keehner since my days in the seminary and we have been good friends. Fr. John is a kind and holy man and a very pastoral priest and pastor. It will be a blessing

for the Church and the good people of the Sioux City Diocese. Unfortunately for the good people of the Diocese of Youngstown it will be bittersweet, one of our own is doing well, but we lose a great priest.

Unfortunately the Holy See will not replace Fr. Keehner with another priest to take his place. It means our Diocese will have 51 active priests serving 71 parishes. It does mean that we will need to promote and pray for more vocations to the priesthood, but it will not be something that will happen overnight. Formation for the priesthood requires four years of college and five years of graduate school including a parish internship.

There is another vocation that everyone has from the day of our baptism, it is our baptismal call to be a disciple of Jesus. We still need to answer this call and cultivate it in our faith communities. This can play an important part to promoting vocations to the priesthood and religious life, but can also play an important part in the life of the parish in the present. This means reflecting on how we can become a more active participant in the life and ministry of the parish, instead of merely being a passive consumer of religion.

This will most likely not happen overnight as well, but it shouldn't take us nine years. This will mean learning about how we got to where we are and how we need to rethink our past and open ourselves to the transformative work of the Holy Spirit. As we observe this Jubilee Year of Hope, we can look at the life and mission of Jesus, who came to show us the way to new life. A life transformed by His life, death, and resurrection, and shared with us through the waters of baptism.
