Dear Brothers and Sisters,



Last week a team of representatives from our parishes had our first virtual meeting with Jim Luisi from the Catholic Leadership Institute. This is the second step in the Next Generation Diocese program to help each parish utilize the survey data to develop growth

plans. A day later the priests of the Diocese had a daylong meeting also with the Catholic Leadership Institute to help us work in the development of our parish growth plans, and to help each priest work on individual growth plans for leadership and ministry.

You may remember us encouraging as many people as possible taking the Disciple Maker Index Survey, DMI survey for short. There was a very good response from all the parishes. We were commended for our participation and how it will be helpful to us. The data from all three parishes show that we are very similar in many ways. The data is broken down into demographics, strengths and opportunities, beliefs in Catholic teachings, effectiveness of parish support, and what the CLI sees as four factors of a thriving parish; leadership, Sunday experience, spiritual practices, and missionary impulse.

We are early in this process that will continue for four years as we find three priorities for parish growth, set goals to address these priorities and make workable plans to reach those goals. One of the things we looked at was demographic data with the age of the parishioners in particular. Most of our parishioners are over the age of 55. That means most of us are Baby Boomers with a few of the Greatest Generation and Silent Generation on one end and some of us Generation X-ers on the other end. We have fewer parishioners from the Millennial Generation and Generation Z. These last two groups would be between the ages of 13 and 43, with the Millennial Generation the largest age group replacing the Baby Boomers, who are currently the second largest age group.

Looks like we have our work cut out for ourselves. This is something to think about and definitely pray about. It will also need more than just thoughts and prayers, but that is what we will be working to, with some help from our Lord.
